Telephone bids accepted for live auction items during June 15 fundraiser

Lexington, KY – (June 4, 2013) – A one-of-a-kind experience – a stay at WinStar Farm featuring dinner with University of Kentucky head football coach Mark Stoops – will be auctioned to the highest bidder at the 10th annual NIGHT OF THE STARS, the gala fundraiser for Central Kentucky Riding for Hope (CKRH), on June 15 at the Keeneland Entertainment Center in Lexington. CKRH is a 32-year-old program based at the Kentucky Horse Park in Lexington that offers a variety of equine-assisted activities and therapies for people of all ages.

"Black & White Gala" is the theme of this year's NIGHT OF THE STARS, which includes cocktails, dinner and silent and live auctions. The event begins at 6 p.m., and individual tickets are \$125.

"CKRH has a wonderful facility thanks in large measure to the people and organizations who supported the first NIGHT OF THE STARS in 2004," said CKRH Executive Director Pat Kline. "The perception in 2013 might be that we have finished our fundraising work, but this is not the case. We are challenged every day to develop programs that benefit our community, and we must continually raise funds to ensure their future. The help we receive at NIGHT OF THE STARS is paramount to our continued success."

WinStar Farm, one of the Thoroughbred industry's most successful breeding and racing operations, has donated one overnight stay at its charming guest house on the farm's peaceful 1,864 acres of quintessential Bluegrass horse country. The package includes a private tour with the management team and see stallions, broodmares, foals and yearlings, as well as dinner with Coach Stoops and guest that will be prepared by Apiary and owner/chef Cooper Vaughn, a graduate of the prestigious Le Cordon Bleu.
